

READING FREUD

The Reading Freud seminar chaired by Robert Galatzer-Levy, M.D. and Bertram Cohler, Ph.D. is entering its third year. The last two years have been extremely rewarding. Our plan is to carefully read the entire body of Freud's work over the next several years. We are now working through *The Interpretation of Dreams* and are currently completing Chapter 5.

The seminar includes a wide range of individuals including psychoanalysts, faculty of local universities from various departments, analytic candidates and students at all levels. **New members are welcome to join the seminar at any time.** This seminar meets on the first Wednesday of each month at 7:15-9:00 PM at the Chicago Institute for Psychoanalysis, 13th Floor, 122 South Michigan Avenue. (The November 2011 meeting will be on the second Wednesday of the month.) There is no fee. The only requirement is an interest in the careful study of Freud's writing.

Dr. Galatzer-Levy is a training and supervising psychoanalyst for children, adolescents and adults with interests in psychoanalysis as a developmental psychology and chaos theory and its application to psychoanalysis. Dr. Cohler is a psychoanalyst who shares Dr. Galatzer-Levy's interest in psychoanalysis as a developmental psychology and psychoanalysis as both a clinical and a social theory. The seminar leaders are on the faculty of the Chicago Institute for Psychoanalysis and The University of Chicago.

Readings are based on the Strachey translation of the Standard Edition as well as more recent translations where available. Electronic access to the Library is helpful since the world's psychoanalytic literature, including the Standard Edition is available on-line.
